COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

CITY OF VIRGINIA, MINNESOTA, July 17, 2018

Regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Virginia, Minnesota, was called to order by Mayor Cuffe Jr. at 6:30 P.M. in the Council Chambers, City Hall.

Mayor Cuffe led the Pledge of Allegiance.

City Administrator See-Benes discussed the repair or razing of the property located at due to the condition of the property. Mr. Garrit Kaivola was present and is willing to demo the property and give to the City to avoid enforcement of the order. The Council agreed to change item #3 in the Resolution from 20 to 30 days.

Moved by Councillor Johnson, supported by Councillor Baranzelli to adopt Resolution 18100 ordering the repair and/or razing of a hazardous building located at 117 11th Street South, Parcel Code 090-0060-00550 with the amendment to item #3 to increase from 20 to 30 days before enforcement of the order. Resolution adopted unanimously.

- 1) Approve a variance to build a 2nd accessory structure (garage).
- 2) Approve a variance to build a 2nd accessory structure (garage) in the front yard
- 3) Approve a 9 foot variance to the required 20 foot setback abutting city R/W in order to construct a new garage 11 feet from the West property line (3rd Avenue).
- 4) Approve a 2 foot variance to the required 5 foot variance side yard setback to build a new garage 3 feet from the East property line
- 5) Approve a 416 square foot variance to the maximum 1,000 square foot allowable structure in order to construct a new garage 1,152 square feet with a total square footage of 1,416 (including existing garage)

City Administrator See-Benes explained to the Council about a discrepancy in the quote for the Road Reconstruction Project signage. The signs are \$8,500 per sign v.s. the \$850 per sign as had been bid. The overall bid result would not have changed. This is covered under the State Aid Funds. The City has three options to resolve the issue:

- 1) Hold at their price that they quoted
- 2) Do a change order and pay the revised price. \$9,000 per sign total \$18,000
- 3) Take signs out of project and do at a later date

Moved by Councillor Friedlieb, supported by Councillor Jorgensen to approve the purchase of the signs as part of the project at the revised price of \$9,000 per sign for the 2018 Road Reconditioning Project (12th Avenue South and 13th Street South) Motion Carried.

Moved by Councillor Baribeau, supported by Councillor Johnson to approve the SWOP requests for the Community Fundraiser to be held on August 30, 2018 at the Virginia Elks from 5:00 – 8:00 p.m. and to list on the City calendar, all a classic car parade along Chestnut Street, and post parking for classic cars. Motion Carried.

Moved by Councillor Paulsen, supported by Councillor Jorgensen to adopt Resolution 18102 to approve the contract with Kimley Horn for plans, specs and bidding for 529 Chestnut Street Pocket Park. Resolution adopted unanimously.
