Enclosed is a list of properties that forfeited to the State of Minnesota 12/2/2013 for non-payment of real estate taxes related to the 3 year judgment for 2009, the 5 year Judgment for 2007, and prior years' judgments picked up.

Minnesota Statutes provide that the County Board shall classify these lands as conservation or non-conservation and establish a sales list. The Board in making such classification can utilize information from various sources including local governments, state agencies, and staff.

In order to classify property as conservation or non-conservation the Board must consider the following statutorily determined factors:

1. The present use of adjacent parcels
2. The potential productivity of the soil
3. The character of any forests or other vegetation
4. The existing and potential accessibility to established roads, schools, and other public services.
5. The suitability or desirability of the land for particular uses.

You should be aware that except for lands in state parks, peat lands, mineral stockpiles, land on waterways, non-forested marginal lands, and wetlands, all forfeited properties could be eligible for sale regardless of the classification.

This is your opportunity to provide relevant information to the county board prior to classification of the properties. Please review the list and send any comments and information within 30 days regarding specific properties to:

Councillor Ralston reviewed a proposed expansion project for the Kunnari's Farmers Market on 8th Street South, which includes the development of a restaurant/café in conjunction with their farmers market. Discussion was held on a financing/tax abatement packet over a ten year period to help defray the City portion of their property taxes.

a. **Moved by Russo and supported by Cuffe to recommend that the Virginia Economic Development Authority formulate a Development Agreement with the Kunnari's to provide tax relief for a ten year period. Motion carried.**

b. **Moved by Russo and supported by Baranzelli to authorize the City Administrator and Finance Director to obtain additional information on a special levy that could be utilized for economic development projects. Motion carried.**

Police Chief Benz stated he requested three proposals to purchase a new 2014 police vehicle and received one quote from Lundgren Motors, in the amount of \$27,981.41, for a 2014 Ford Utility Police Interceptor.

c. **Moved by Cuffe and supported by Baribeau to adopt a Resolution accepting the quote from Lundgren Motors, in the amount of \$27,981.41, to purchase a 2014 Ford Utility Police Interceptor. Motion carried.**

Discussion was held on the letter from KCPRO East Oval Ice Racing requesting permission to hold a snowmobile race on Bailey's Lake on January 11, 2014, and for a cash sponsorship.

d. **Moved by Sipola and supported by Cuffe to authorize KCPRO East Oval Ice Racing to hold a snowmobile race on Bailey's Lake on January 11, 2014. Motion carried.**

e. **Moved by Cuffe and supported by Sipola to deny the request from KCPRO East Oval Ice Racing for a cash sponsorship. Motion carried.**

City Administrator Tourville recommended continuing with the professional engineering services from Short Elliott Hendrickson for the year 2014. SEH Engineering has agreed to provide the engineering services at their 2013 rates.

City Administrator Tourville stated he has been working with the owners involved in the development of the dental office on Fourth Street North. City Administrator Tourville recommended utilizing up to \$125,000 from the \$1.26 million in excess taconite funding to reimburse the developer for infrastructure and site improvements for the dental project.

Councillor Cuffe called the meeting to order at 9:50 AM.

Police Chief Benz stated their department is currently down to sixteen officers, with nineteen officers included in the budget. Police Chief Benz requested permission to move forward with the hiring of two police officers at this time. An eligibility list has been established and extensive background checks have been completed on the top five candidates.

Moved by Russo and supported by Baribeau to approve the hiring of two police officers.

Motion carried.

(NOTE: Two resolutions are included in the Council packet to hire the two police officers.)

A lengthy discussion took place on the involvement of the Fire/Ambulance Department in various sporting and fundraising events. It was the consensus of the committee that the Fire Chief must inform the City Administrator of any events that the Fire Department will participate in, which are above the realm of their day to day operations. The City Administrator will then notify the City Council of any special events that the Fire/Ambulance Department participates in.

Fire Chief L'Allier stated the Minnesota High School League requires that a trained medical person is in attendance at the school sporting events. At times, the Virginia School has requested the Fire/Ambulance personnel to fill in for the medical trainer that is hired by the school district. Mayor Russo stated there is currently a policy in place between the Virginia School District and Police Department to pay for a police officer to attend certain sporting events, that is paid by the school district. It was noted there is not a policy in place for the Fire/Ambulance Department. No action was taken.

City Administrator Tourville stated no applications were received for the full time City Assessor position, or for the position on a contract basis. City Administrator Tourville distributed a copy of an email from Mark Monacelli, St. Louis County, defending the actions that took place in the City of Gilbert regarding property valuations.

Councillor Cuffe stated he will schedule a Personnel Committee meeting to discuss a plan to fill the City Assessor position.
