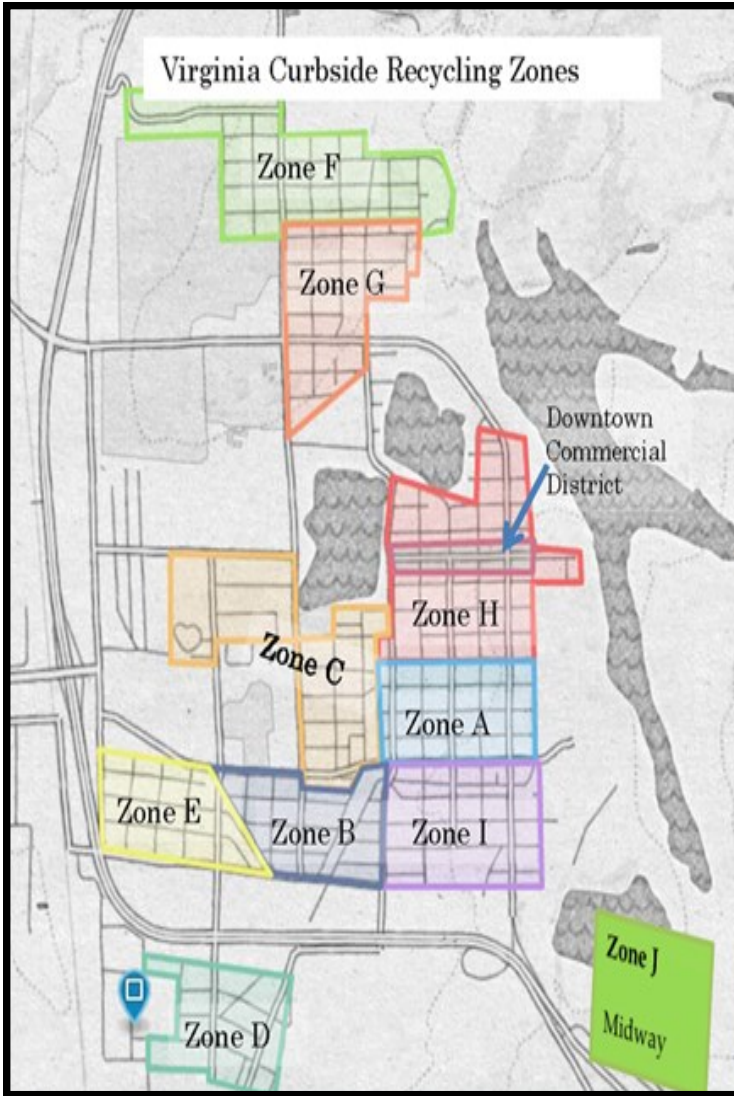


# RECYCLE *TODAY* FOR A BETTER *TOMORROW*!

### HOW DO I START RECYCLING?

Place your items neatly sorted in paper bags, boxes or baskets on the curb in front of your home by 7:00 am on your recycling day. PLEASE, DO NOT PLACE IN THE ALLEY

### WHAT DAYS DO YOU PICK UP RECYCLING?

Residential Recycling is picked up every other week. Find your zone on the map. Use the grid below to see what days we pick up in your area.

- Zone A:** 5th Street South– 8th Street South, RR Ave through 600 Blk.
- Zone B:** Lenci & Scanlon, 9th Street South through 13th Street South, 600-1100 Blk.
- Zone C:** Vets Addition, College Park, 2nd Street S. through 8th Street S, 600 Blk. Thru 1200 Block, Northside of 3rd Street S.
- Zone D:** Ridgewood & Briarwood Estates
- Zone E:** Williams, Sunset, Larden, Pinemill, 3rd between 9th & 12th Avenue
- Zone F:** Northside of Northside, Pillsbury Addition, 14th Street North thru 18th Street North
- Zone G:** Southside of Northside, 9th Street N. through 13th Street N., Fairview Addition, Olcott Addition
- Zone H:** 4th Street S Through 5th Street N., Franklin & Finntown N, RR Ave Through 6th Avenue
- Zone I:** 8 1/2 Street S through 12th Street S
- Zone J:** Midway Area (through Bourgin Road)

## HOW TO PREPARE AND SORT YOUR CURBSIDE RECYCLABLES

**Mixed Paper:** newspaper, magazines, junk mail, office paper, box board, catalogs up to 1/2 inch thick

Place in a paper grocery bag or loosely in a bin.

Please make sure your recycling won't blow down the street when you put it at the curb.



**Cardboard:** Cardboard flattened and cut into 2'x2' sections will be picked up through your curbside program. Cardboard may also be dropped off at one of several drop off locations throughout St. Louis County.



**No wet cardboard, pizza boxes or plastic coated cardboard please!**

**Glass:** all glass food and beverage bottles and jars. *No lids.* Rinse, drain and store separately in a paper grocery bag.



**Examples** of items that are NOT accepted:

- Improperly sorted materials
- Egg cartons
- Packaging contaminated with grease or food
- Tissue or gift wrapping paper
- Frozen or refrigerated food packaging
- Misc. metals such as hangers, pots/pans
- Window glass, light bulbs, ceramics, dishes
- Misc. plastics such as toys, dishes, lawn ornaments
- Motor oil containers
- Plastic bags (collected at our transfer stations and some big box stores)

**Plastics:** all #1 and #2 plastic bottles, tubs and jars. *No caps or lids.*

Rinse, drain, flatten and Place in a paper grocery bag or bin.



**Metal cans:** aluminum, tin and bi-metal food and beverage cans. Rinse drain, flatten and store with plastics and cartons.



**Cartons:** **\*NEW\*** gabled (milk, cream, egg substitute, etc.) and aseptic (juice boxes, soup boxes, gravies, sauces) cartons. *No caps or lids.* Rinse, drain, flatten and store with plastics and cans.



Make sure recycling is in FRONT of your residence by 7:00 am on your designated day. Recyclables can be put in a cardboard box, laundry basket, plastic bin or simply separated into paper bags.

## HOW TO DISPOSE OF HAZARDOUS WASTES & YARD MATERIALS

Household Hazardous Waste can be brought to the HHW facility at the Regional Landfill on Highway 53 in Virginia. They are open on Tuesdays and Saturdays from 8am-1pm

The following problem materials can be recycled at one of several St. Louis County Solid Waste sites for **FREE**:

- 2 appliances per trip
- 4 tires per trip
- 6 fluorescent tubes or CFLs per trip
- 6 drained oil filters per trip
- Used oil, car batteries and antifreeze
- Scrap metal
- Yard waste, brush and branches

### BE CAUTIOUS WHEN HANDLING HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTES!

- Transport in containers that don't leak.
- Keep in original packaging if possible. If not, label the container with content ingredients.
- Secure fluorescent lights and glass containers so they do not break and release hazardous vapors in your vehicles
