You are encouraged to take advantage of the City of Virginia's Residential Curbside Recycling Program. It's FREE and CONVENIENT! Pick-up days are regularly scheduled every other week in your Virginia Curbside Recycling Zone.

Zone A: 5th Street South– 8th Street South, RR Ave through 600 Blk.

Zone B: Lenci & Scanlon, 9th Street South through 13th Street South, 600-1100 Blocks

Zone C: Vets Addition, College Park, 2nd Street S. through 8th Street S., 600 Blk. Thru 1200 Block, Northside of 3rd Street S.

Zone D: Ridgewood & Briarwood Estates

Zone E: Williams, Sunset, Larden, Pinemill, 3rd between 9th & 12th Avenue

Zone F: Northside of Northside, Pillsbury Addition, 14th Street North thru 18th Street North

Zone G: Southside of Northside, 9th Street N. through 13th Street N., Fairview Addition, Olcott Addition

Zone H: 4th Street S Through 5th Street N., Franklin & Finntown N, RR Ave Through 6th Avenue

Zone I: 8 1/2 Street S through 12th Street S

Zone J: Midway to Bourgin Rd.

Please note — there will be NO recycling or trash picked up on the following holidays: New Years Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving or Christmas Day.

How to Prepare & Sort Your Curbside Recyclables

Place your neatly sorted recyclables **IN FRONT** of your residence before 7 AM on your designated pick-up day. Use paper bags, boxes or baskets to sort. Put them on the curb in front of your home on your recycling day.

Mixed Paper

Newspapers including inserts, magazines and catalogs up to 1/2-inch thick, junk mail, paper-board (cereal and beverage boxes)

Place in a paper grocery bag or loosely in a bin. Please make sure your paper recycling will not blow down the street when you place it at the curb.

NO egg cartons, frozen or refrigerated food packages, paper plates, napkins, paper towels, pizza boxes, tissue or gift wrapping paper, or paper-board contaminated with grease or food.



Plastics

All #1 and #2 plastic necked bottles and jugs

Remove and throw away all caps or lids. Removing labels is not necessary. Rinse, drain, flatten and place in a paper grocery bag or bin. Can be sorted with metal cans and cartons. NO plastic bags, toys, toy packages, dishes, motor oil containers or lawn ornaments.



Cardboard

Flattened, cut into 2' x 2' sections and bundled

Corrugated, shipping-type cardboard ONLY. Please do not include wet cardboard, pizza boxes or plastic-coated cardboard. Cardboard may also be dropped off at one of several drop-off locations throughout St. Louis County.



Metal Cans

Aluminum, tin and bi-metal food and beverage cans

Remove and throw away any lids. Rinse, drain, flatten and place in a paper grocery bag or bin. Can be sorted with plastics and cartons. NO scrap or miscellaneous metals like hangers, pipes, pails, pots and pans, paint cans or other containers that held hazardous waste.



Glass

Brown, green and clear glass food and beverage bottles and jars

Remove and throw away all caps and metal rings. Rinse clean, drain and place in a paper grocery bag or bin. Removing the labels is not necessary. NO light bulbs, window glass, mirrors, dishes, drinking glasses or ceramic items.



Cartons

Gabled (milk, cream, egg substitute, etc.) and aseptic (juice boxes, soup boxes, gravies, sauces)

Remove and throw away any caps or straws. Rinse, drain, flatten and place in a paper grocery bag or bin. Can be sorted with plastics and metal cans.



The City of Virginia encourages you to take advantage of our regularly scheduled recycling pick up. Recycling saves you money by reducing the amount you pay for trash disposal. By recycling more at your curb, you will also help the City of Virginia keep garbage rates down!
